Name it or lose it!

Even though the term is just a few weeks old, there are dozens of sweatshirts in the lost property basket. Most of them are brand new! Several people have gone through them looking for names so that they could be

returned to their rightful owner but there are simply no readable names on them. School uniform gives the children a sense of belonging to a community and we instil in the children that they should be proud to wear the Perryfields uniform.

Please teach your children to look after their things and also please name every piece of clothing and equipment clearly. If nobody claims the items in lost property we give it away to a charity.

A few reminders

I cannot emphasise enough the fact that your children must not go on the climbing frame either before or after school. Children are only allowed on the climbing frame (or adventure playground as we call it in school) when there is a member of the school staff supervising.

The school's insurance is only valid if a member of the staff team are with the children.

Similarly, the Foundation Stage team are using the covered area outside their classrooms considerably more than previously. Please do not allow your children to play in this area before or after school. The activities which are set up form part of the Foundation Stage curriculum and have been set up for a purpose—they are not simply for children to play with.

We would all very much appreciate your support in this. Children should also not run wildly around the playground, in the morning or after school tempting though it may be.

Please insist that your child stands with you quietly while you wait for the bell signalling the start of the school day. Children can then walk calmly into school thus giving them a more settled beginning to their lessons.

Similarly, there have been occasions this term when pre-school children have become distressed because they have got lost in the playground. Please ensure that you know where your children are and that they are supervised closely.

Change of dates and more dates

The term has well and truly started and the children and staff have already been working hard. As always we try to pre plan key events and unfortunately sometimes these dates clash. The individual **photographer** has now been moved to Friday 9th October. On the 16th October at 2.00pm we are inviting the Year 1 parents and carers into school to hear about our great Year 1 reading project that all the Year 1 children and parents will be taking part in.

The parent assessment meeting has now been changed to Friday 20th November at 2.30pm. This is an opportunity for all parents to gain a greater understanding on how we assess children's learning, progress and attainment throughout the school. Coffee Mornings—this year we are introducing informal coffee mornings where you are able to meet members of the school team to gage more information about

specific areas of school life and ask questions. It is also a good opportunity to make links with other parents. Our first coffee morning will be held by Mrs Barnett the school Senco (special educational needs co-ordinator) and Miss Connett the Early Years Leader. If you have a child with additional needs and would like to find out more about the role of the school Senco and how we support children with additional needs please come along (more details to follow).
