Holidays during term time

Summer is just around the corner and with it comes the thought of all those warm, lazy, hazy days! It is a great time for the children here at school. PE is often outside, the allotments will be planted and playtimes are more pleasant!

It is also a time when families may decide to have a holiday or mini-break together. However, I must remind you all that children should not be taken out of school during term time.

This is a very important term for your children, they will be

consolidating all of their learning from the year. This applies in particular to Year 2 children. During the month of May, teachers are making their final assessments of the children in reading, writing, maths and science. These levels are reported to you in their end of year report and also form the basis for learning in the junior school. The Year 1 children will be taking the National Year 1 phonics check. Unless, they are poorly, children should be in school at all times.

As a parent myself, I do appreciate that holidays during term time tend to

be cheaper but nothing can compensate for lost days at school.

Time out of school during school hours, unless it is an emergency should be avoided. If an appointment has to be made during the school day, an appointment card or letter from the surgery or hospital should be seen by the school, beforehand.

If your child is to achieve their full potential they need to have the consistency of learning that daily and regular attendance brings.



Summer days

Whilst we are on the subject of summer there are a few more things which I need to bring your attention to.

Children should always have a water bottle in school. There are times in the classroom when staff will ask the children to have a drink. At other times children are free to drink water whenever they want to.

A sun hat needs to be worn at all times when children are out in the playground. Sun hats can be purchased from the school uniform shop but please ensure that they are clearly marked with vour child's name.

Sun cream should be applied before school—it
cannot be brought into
school nor can staff apply
it.
