Reading Skills

This final term is always extremely busy for both the staff and children. However, there won't be any relaxation in the classroom. The children are all working hard, and will be right up until the end of term.

At school all the staff work tirelessly to teach the children reading skills through phonics, guided reading and grammar lessons and games.

Reading only at school however is not enough for the children to perfect the fluency and reading comprehension skills that they will need in later life. Please can I ask you to encourage your children to read to an adult or older sibling at home at least 5 times a week (only for 10 minutes each time).

We would appreciate your support with this. Like I said, it is vital that the children read regularly at home to enhance their learning in the classroom. Please can you also remember to record that your child has read in their reading diary. This is extremely helpful

information for the teachers.
