Thursday night is club night!

Our very popular 'Club Night' is back! Children from Years 1 and 2 are invited to attend one of the after school clubs run by a member of staff. Teachers and LSAs freely give up their time so that the children can have some extra curricular activities. Unlike the clubs run by outside agencies, these clubs are free!

They are designed to give children a taster of something different—something perhaps they have never tried before. We ask that children choose 3

clubs that they would like to attend (not in preference order) so hopefully they are allocated one of their choices. However, it may be that due to high demand for particular clubs, they are allocated one which they haven't chosen. Please don't let them be put off! The idea is that they try something new and work alongside difchildren-who ferent knows, they may make a brand new friend!

The clubs begin on Thursday 14th May and there are 6 sessions. Children are escorted to their club by a member of staff at 3pm and should be collected promptly at 3.45 pm. We will let you know from which door to collect your child nearer the time. If your child is to go home with someone who would not normally collect them, please let their class teacher know in writing.

Finally, clubs are a privilege for Year 1 and 2 children. The current Foundation Stage will get their turn next year—they are a little young to have their school day extended any further.

Please remember too, that if your child would rather go home as normal at 3.05 pm that is absolutely fine—club night is optional!
