Deputy Headteacher's Diary

It has been another busy week at Perryfields Infant School. During my walks around the school I have seen children working really hard to develop new skills or apply skills they had already learned. In Foundation Stage, the children were weighing things and making predictions about which brick would weigh more, Lego or wooden. In Year 1, the children were creating pictograms in the computer suite, while in Year 2 they were learning to multiply by creating arrays. One child was heard to say "I was red yesterday but today I really get it!" while another subtly reminded their teacher, "You might need to double click it again if it doesn't work the first time!" Everywhere there was a buzz about learning. What a fantastic school to belong to!

A Few Reminders

<u>Start of day</u>—please can I remind parents that all children need to be in school by 9:05am at the latest. Doors open at 8:55am to give everyone ten minutes to be in school. This is an important time of the day when key phonics, spellings and morning work takes place. It also causes disruption to the class when children arrive late via the front entrance. Thank you for your support with this.

Considerate parking—please remember that parking is prohibited between 8-9am and 3-4pm on parts of Lawn Lane and near the pedestrian crossing. I appreciate that everyone is busy and in a rush however there have been several reports that cars have been parked inconsiderately on paths, corners, double yellow lines etc. Apart from being illegal it is extremely dangerous with cars reversing and parking where families with young children are walking and needing pushchair access. <u>New Communication Assistant</u>— This week our new Communication Assistant joined the school. Sonia will be working with specific children to help support their speech and language development every Thursday across the school.

Zone of Regulation Parent Workshop— This week we held a remote parent workshop on the Zones of Regulation. This is a whole school approach with helping children to begin to self regulate their own emotions and learn different strategies. Online Safety Training For Parents From the 2 Johns

Just a reminder of the online safety training below.

The Essex Safeguarding Children Board (ESCB) is offering online safety training for parents and people working with children and young people (delivered by the 2 Johns). It will take place on Thursday 3rd February 2022 and will explore how young people are navigating around restrictions and using the internet without parents' knowledge. This session will explore solutions that parents and professionals can adopt to help keep children safe. This will be a Facebook Live for parents on Thursday 3 February at 6pm. Anyone wishing to attend will need to go to The 2 Johns EST Safety Facebook page. It will look at:

- The online world and how our young people are using it. It will explore how they are navigating around restrictions and using the internet without parents knowledge.
- Content in regards to favourite apps and games
- Look at the dangers young people face, not only from predatory people, but also how they are being
 groomed in games which ranges from receiving gifts for the young player (typically Primary age) and being groomed on servers for the older players.
- Bully across all age ranges.
- The use that gangs make of the online world.
