Dear Parents and Children,

I hope you are all well and coping during these difficult times.

The feedback from staff about our home learning this term has been extremely positive. The calls home as a supportive tool and the sequential lesson plans and worksheets have been positively received. It seems the majority of children and parents are accessing learning through our website and are really engaging with the lessons. Staff have enjoyed looking at and marking the children's work on DB Primary and it has been wonderful for the team to see the great work that the children have been doing at home with your support.

Due to being unwell, I was unable to lead the first whole school assembly last Friday. Fortunately, Mrs Champion was able to take my place and the feedback received was extremely positive. It is lovely to hear that the children all enjoyed seeing each other on the screen and I look forward to seeing everyone soon. I am hoping to make these assembly a weekly occurrence once I am better. Moving forward, these will be Monday morning assemblies as class Zoom meetings will be taking place on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. A Zoom invitation will follow shortly.

This week the team have been working extremely hard to create mini-support videos and will be introducing Zoom meetings starting this Wednesday. Please remember that all children are appropriately dressed and that you are at hand nearby for the duration of the meeting to help with any IT needs.

Exercise books and worksheets are available to those who are unable to access them in year group boxes under the bike shelters. These will be available each Monday after 9:30am. If you are experiencing problems accessing the website, or you need help with IT devices, then please let us know. As previously explained, the expectation is that KS1 children are provided with 3 hours of work a day (2.5hrs for F/S). Due to the age of our children and the wide range of family circumstances we would like all children to join in with as much learning as they can. Remember that you are all doing a fantastic job!

Prior to Christmas we were extremely fortunate not to have any known positive Covid-19 cases in school. As you are aware, the number of Covid-19 cases continue to be high in Essex. The new variant has meant that the transmission rate is much faster. Even by following stringent cleaning schedules and following the government guidelines, I can report that some members of our staff have tested positive for coronavirus including myself and other staff/children are having to isolate. In line with government guidelines we have had to close our Year 2 and Foundation Stage Key Worker bubbles and everyone involved is having to self-isolate at home. If there are no further positive cases the Year 2 Key Worker bubble will be able to return to school on Monday 25th January and the Foundation Stage Key Worker bubble can return on Tuesday 26th January. Due to staffing issues it has been difficult for us to provide the before and afterschool 'Peardrops' provision for the key worker children this week. We always endeavour to provide as much notice as possible about any school closures but due to the ever changing nature of this virus it isn't always possible.

Staff symptoms have varied from light symptoms to some staff being very poorly. Having experienced this illness first hand, I must emphasise how important it is for everyone to follow the government rules of,

HANDS + FACE + SPACE.

The team will continue to work from home to provide all children with access to the remote learning. I would like to wish all the staff and anyone in our local community with this horrible virus a speedy recovery.
