
We have a very quick turn around between session, so please collect your children promptly.

New Books

We have recently purchased some new reading books, library books and dictionaries. The children are excited by the new and varied books. As you can appreciate these specialised books are expensive and we have spent thousands of pounds of them. Please can you teach your children to respect the books and treat them with care. As you know school's budgets are shrinking and we need to be careful with the resources we have.

Please remember that water bottles must NOT go inside the book bags as they can leak and ruin the books. Damaged books will be charged for. Parents will receive a letter stating which books have been damaged and how much they need to pay. Each book will cost £5 to replace.

Rucksacks — Children should only be bringing in the Perryfields Infant School small rucksacks (see photos). These are large enough to hold the children's books, reading diary and they have an excellent holder on the outside to hold a school water bottle. The school water bottles are the correct size to fit into the bottle holder and also fit into the water bottle boxes in school. These are available at reception and are very reasonably priced at £2 each. The larger bottles tend to leak and do not fit into the school boxes.
