Evidence can then be seen in their planning and lessons. ON Wednesday 18th November al staff Went on CPD course for safety in Gymnastics to refresh and help with teaching the basic rolls. This was then seen applied into lessons when observed for Year 2.</p> <p>Last year after having the specialist teachers into the school the children were asked how they enjoyed their PE lessons and the result was outstanding. All the Class teachers are being up skilled and enjoying teaching a range of games and activities. Both boosting their confidence. We have seen an increase in children taking part in after school clubs and generally more excited to take part in their PE lessons this is helping to provide a sustainable improvement to our PE lessons. Also less active children taking part in before and after school clubs and PP children. Specialist teachers are helping our teachers to encourage those children that need more support in PE and also making sure our talented children are having lots of opportunities to be challenged.</p>

To allow teachers to teach backward rolls 2 of the same size benches will be required and at present we only have 3 which are all different sizes.</p> <p>SEN equipment – An increase number of SEN children at Perryfields has shown how we need to develop the children's needs in PE. Slowly we are building up a bank of resources we feel would benefit all children and provide equal opportunities for all children to take part in PE.</p> <p>It has been decided that use of the grass area is no longer needed and a bigger investment, which will provide a greater opportunity for the children in the school and the future children of Perryfields Infant School will be an astroturf small football pitch complete with 2 goals. The area in consideration is the allotment area by the family room.</p> <p><i>This has been built and used during the partial closure of school and has provided an additional play space to allow social distancing between bubbles. It has been well used and the children have thoroughly enjoyed using this new area and equipment.</i></p> <p>All necessary resources are in place to deliver the revised P.E Curriculum.</p>

To summarise the following measured impact can be evidenced:

- Children engaging in more competitions and different sports
- A great sense of team work and positive competitiveness in PE lessons
- Teacher confidence and enthusiasm for PE has been raised as a result of specialist teaching.
- PE lessons including a greater variety of activities and challenge.
- Attendance of after school clubs has been increased.
- Children transferring skills learnt in PE into their playground games.
- All children given equal opportunities to take part in all PE lessons and competitions.

Perryfields Infant School sporting achievements to March 20th 2020:

1. Cross country Running – 18 children participated from FS and Y1 and Y2. We came 4th place overall against 21 other schools. With 2 gold medals, 1 FS boy and 1 FS girl and 4 silver medals to 1 FS girl, 1 Year 1 boy and 1 Year 2 boy and girl! Also 1st place for FS boys and girls overall. Last year was impressive but this year we did amazing again!
2. KS1 Dance festival – 22 children from Year 1 – 2nd Place
3. All-inclusive festival – 3 children participated from Y1 and YR2
4. Teddy Olympics – 8 children participated from Year 1. We came 1st place on our afternoon against 15 other teams. Overall out of 60 teams across the 2 days we came 6th place.
