

Geography – continents, oceans and weather

Continents – Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, South America Australasia, Antarctica

Art: printing

Vegetable cut: shapes cut out of a vegetable to leave a shape

Press print: shapes pressed into a soft material to leave an area that will not print.

Design and Technology: food technology (biscuits)

Investigating ingredients, designing a product, learning techniques, applying them, evaluating the finished product.



Science - Animals

Mammals – have hair and produce milk

Birds – have feathers and lay eggs.

Reptiles – have scaly skin, usually lay eggs.

Amphibians – lay eggs, live part of life in water.

Insects – have an exoskeleton and lay eggs.

Pictogram: where a picture indicates a number of objects

Bar chart/ histogram: number indicate by a bar or block
