Year 2 Phonics Check Results

Every year the Year 1 pupils have to sit a national phonics check in June. This is where the class teacher completes a mini test on a one to one basis with each child. It includes some words which are fake or non-words as well as proper words. There are 40 words for the children to decode and the expected level is very high. Due to COVID, these phonics checks did not take place in Year 1 last year so they took place nationally in Year 2 in November 2022. All of the children have been working hard with their phonics and grammar learning and all made good progress. I am please to say that there was a 93% pass rate.

There are so many different ways in which children learn to read. Looking at the pictures, the shape of the word, making sense of the story and of course the sound the letters make—phonics. In addition, we try to instil a love of books and being read to and reading. We are really excited about our up and coming author visit on World Book Day Thursday 3rd March.

School Office—we still continue to be short staffed in the office. Please can I remind everyone that school starts at 8:55am. Children who are late miss an important settling in time in the classrooms where morning work has already started and children are given the daily timetable so they know what is happening. Children who are late are also disruptive to the whole class by coming into school late. With only one person in the office it is difficult to answer the reception door as promptly as usual which will make them even later. From my window I can see that several children are regularly late. If you do have a problem getting your child into school on time please make an appointment to see me. A big thank you to Mrs Farmer for organising the office by herself.

After Half Term—From Monday 21st February we are returning to our 'normal' morning times. All children and parents are to wait in the playground until the bell gets rung at 8:55am by a member of staff. Children are expected to stand by their adults side (not playing on equipment or running around) to ensure a calm start to the school day. When the bell is rung to indicate the start of the school day the children then walk into class. Anyone who is not in class by 9am will be classed as late.
