Everyone in school has been thinking and working hard towards our new Core Value 'PERSEVERANCE' and thinking about being resilient and never giving up. On Monday we had an interesting assembly about Robert the Bruce and the spider.

We looked back in time many years ago, when Robert the Bruce the king of Scotland went to war with England. Scotland was defeated by the English five times and after his last defeat Robert the Bruce went away and took refuge on an island off the north coast of Ireland. He stayed there for a period of time.

The story goes that whilst hiding away he saw a spider trying to spin a web between two wooden beams. The little creature tried to throw a thread from one beam to another, but failed. Not discouraged, it tried again and again and again and again, but without success. Even after five times the spider did not give up and finally it succeeded. This encouraged Robert the Bruce to not give up or be discouraged.
