The Big Question



Our Core Value for this half term is **RESPECT**.

We have been learning about respecting other people's property and personal body space. It is important that our young children understand that being too close to someone can make them feel uncomfortable and having someone stand too close to them might not be comfortable. We call this our body space.

We have been looking at how children and adults should wait for someone to stop talking before speaking to them and not jump in but wait respectfully until the other person is ready.

They also need to know and understand that their bodies are their own and that no-one should be too close, which includes keeping ourselves safe.

The Big Question this week is — <u>How can we respect other people's personal space and keep each other safe?</u>
