Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that everyone is keeping well.

I just wanted to make you aware that teachers have started to contact parents and children in their classes during this time of partial school closure. I'm sure that several, if not all of you have had these calls already. Staff will be contacting you once every two to three weeks to ensure that all children have a regular 'check in' with their teacher. The Senior Leadership Team will also be making calls. It has been wonderful to touch base with parents and children and just have a quick catch up. This is an ideal opportunity for you to let us know what is and isn't working well about home schooling but most importantly discussing your child's and families well-being. With such a long break from school it is really important that children have the opportunity to keep in touch and even speak to their teachers (if they want to). If the teachers/LSAs are unable to reach you, where possible, they will always leave a message and try to contact you again at a later time.

Should you need to contact your child's class teacher, they are contactable through DB Primary during the week. The school office is also open the majority of the time to help with any queries that you may have.

Everyone is doing such a fab job by following the social distancing rules and keeping themselves safe and well. Take care.

SCHOOL TRANSITIONS

Recently I have had some communication and questions about future transitions into the next year groups for the children and I appreciate that there maybe some anxious children and parents at this current time. I would like to reassure everyone that we have several ideas for future transitions but it is still too early in the term to be thinking about this. Normal transitions usually start in mid June and until we have an idea of a possible school re-opening date we are unable to put any of these plans into action. As yet we have been given no indication of when this will be.

There are various transitions for the team to plan for. Firstly, pre-school children starting school in September, the Foundation Stage children moving to Year 1 and the National Curriculum, Year 1 moving to Year 2 and of course Year 2 moving to the junior school. Being optimistic the children may still get some time in their current year groups this year but if not our transitions will take this into consideration.

In the current situation I would just like to reassure everyone that when we plan these transitions the children's care, friendships and well being are all taken into consideration in addition to their education.

DB PRIMARY AND E-SAFETY

The feedback we've been given from parents so far is that you've been able to access the home learning from our website and follow the plans set by the class teachers which is wonderful. The children seem to be enjoying using Purple Mash and DB Primary to mail their teachers and friends as well as doing some literacy and maths activities.

Please can I remind all parents about the importance of E-safety and to always be aware of which sites the children are going onto. Please monitor this, even when using DB Primary and ensure you know what comments and pictures your children are uploading. Please only type, upload and email suitable comments and photos. When using unfamiliar websites please ensure you are present where you can check the security for your children. Technology is great but remember to keep safe!

CLEANING JOB VACANCY


