Rhyming words

Words rhyme when the end sound or sounds are the same. Only the sounds at the beginning of the words are different. For example, cat and bat, dog and frog.

In poems, the rhymes are usually at the ends of lines. For example,

There was a crooked man and he walked a crooked <u>mile</u>,

He found a crooked sixpence upon a crooked stile.

They only have to sound the same – the spelling can be different. For example, fly and high.

See how many rhyming words you can find. They do not all have to be nouns.
