A GOOD START TO THE DAY—OUTSIDE PLAY EQUIPMENT—

Children must **NOT** climb on or play on any school equipment before or after school as the school's insurance does not cover this. This equipment is only to be used when a member of staff is there. At the start of the day, please ensure that the children stand by your side at all times, ready for a smooth start to school or end of day. Several children have been seen coming out of the playground area by themselves before the bell has been rung, which is a safeguarding concern. Please do not use the football pitch or the wooded area before or after school. Children are aware of these rules so please help them to follow them.

REGULAR READING AT HOME—Please remember to hear and read to your child five times a week. Regular reading and phonics practise is so important for children's learning and to be able to access a range of information as they go through their learning journey.

Remember to write this in their reading record to ensure they get the special reading points to help their class become the first STAR READ-ING CLASS of this academic year. The class who reads the most will get to choose a special treat!
