Online safety message from The 2 Johns

Dear Parents,

The 2 Johns, as they are known, are experts in online safety for children and they put out the following message recently, suggesting that we forward to you:

We are putting out this message due to some very worrying information we have been told by numerous very young children aged between 6 and 10 years of age over the past 3 weeks.

It appears that Online Child Sex Offenders are targeting young children aged between 6 and 10 years of age that are playing well known games and their parents have disabled the online chat function. In many top games typically used by children the game makers have built in safety systems within the chat (for example some games hash tag out swear words)

The offenders are asking the children to make their character do something if their parents have turned off chat (for example jump up and down). They are then given instructions regards how to talk to the offender over a third party application.

The most popular apps being used to get around the chat restrictions are: Facetime, Whatsapp, Messenger and Discord.

When we ask little children how they are getting away with this they have come up with a range of answers. Last week a 6 year old girl said she installed Whatsapp on her phone so she could chat in a popular game and would then uninstall it when she stopped playing. Another explained how she was using Snapchat and gave a detailed breakdown of how she does this.

Today we were told by lots of children in an infant school that they had access to devices in their bedroom that their parents are unaware of. One little girl explained how she hid an Ipod touch in a book so she wasn't detected.

Over half of a year 2 class (Age 6-7) said that they could access the internet in their bedroom even though their parents thought it was turned off. When asked how, some explained how they were hot spotting from other devices in the house.

Of significant concern to us several children today said they were chatting to people in games once their parents go to sleep.

It seems that most of the devices the children are using to chat are ones that parents have previously used and now replaced. As an example a little girl last week explained how she was using her Dads old lood touch that he no longer used. Most of these 'unused' devices are usually already associated with the house wifi and haven't typically been subjected to parental controls.

We ask that our followers with young children check that their children are not getting around chat restrictions by using third party apps and also check that any old devices at home haven't been utilised by their children for use in their bedrooms.

We can't stress how many very young children are talking about this and wouldn't believe it if we weren't seeing and hearing it first hand from the children.

Please share this information with anyone that you feel may need to be made aware.
