Time out of school during school hours, unless is an emergency should be avoided. If an appointment has to be made during the school day, an appointment card or letter from the surgery or hospital should be seen by the school beforehand.

As a school our overall attendance is good. This is because the children want to come to school and as parents you understand that for children to achieve their full potential they need to have the consistency of learning that daily and regular attendance brings.
