History – Queen Victoria

Victoria was Queen from 1837-1901.

Her reign was the longest of any monarch in British history and came to be known as the Victorian era.

Queen Victoria was born on the 24 May in 1819.

At the age of 21, Victoria married Albert, a German Prince.

Queen Victoria died on 22 January, 1901. She was 81 years old.

During her reign factories and machines were built to meet the needs of growing numbers of people. Many new things were invented such as photograph, telephones, electric light bulbs and cars.

Geography – To compare the UK and Australia.



The UK

The United Kingdom is made up of four countries (England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland).

The capital city of England is London, the capital city of Scotland is Edinburgh, the capital city of Wales is Cardiff and the capital city of Northern Ireland is Belfast.

The official flag is the Union Jack.

The population (number of people living there) is around 64 million!

Currently the UK is ruled by Queen Elizabeth II.

The currency (money) in the UK is the pound sterling.

Australia



Australia is made up of 6 states. They are New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, Western Australia and Tasmania.

The capital city of Australia is Canberra.

The Australia flag has a Union Jack and white stars on it.

The population of Australia is around 25 million people!

Queen Elizabeth II is the official reigning monarch of Australia.

The currency in Australia is the Australian dollar.



Science – Plants and seasonal changes

Plants need light, water, warmth and nutrients to grow.

Roots – suck up water and nutrients from the soil.

Stem – transports water and nutrients.

Leaves – make food for the plant from sunlight (photosynthesis).

Flower head – attracts insects to carry/collect pollen.

There are four seasons in the year (Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter).

The weather, plants and hours of daylight change in each.

The days are warmer and lighter in the summer and colder and darker in Winter.
