KEY FINDINGS

As a school we have listened to the parents/carers and from this feedback it is clear that the majority of parents/carers are happy with the amount of homework with 83% stating that the amount is about right.

It was pleasing to hear that the majority of children (87%) enjoy doing their homework. As a school we will continue to ensure the homework is closely differentiated to ensure that some children don't find the work too easy. The expectation is that they should be able to complete their homework with a bit of help or by themselves. As mentioned before the homework is not to learn a new concept but to reinforce their prior learning.

From this feedback we will try to increase the amount of research homework for children to choose from.

The feedback on the overall style of the current homework came across as really positive. From this we will continue with our current approach to homework but will incorporate a wider variety to include more research and practical learning opportunities.

The feedback about the use of computers for homework clearly indicated that although the majority of children have access to a computer, parents were adamant that they didn't want homework through this type of media as yet. The children at Perryfields Infant School are still very young and can already access the school's DB Primary learning platform in school and at home.
